








NATIONAL PARKS

The Canary Islands are a set of islands in the Atlantic Ocean.
Many volcanic eruptions created them over millions of years.
They have a typical volcanic landscape.



This is the Anaga
massif , on Tenerife.

When magma accumulates around a volcano, a volcanic cone is created. This is the Teneguía volcano on La Palma.



A caldera is a big depression. This is the Bandama caldera on the island of Gran Canaria.





The Roque's accumulation of Lava. This is the huge Roque of Agando on La Gomera.

The malpaís landscape is made up of solidified lava flows. This is La Corona, on Lanzarote.



Fuerteventura is famous not only for the beaches but also for the sand dunes.



El Hierro is the youngest island. Five years ago a new volcano was discovered. It was a submarine volcano near the Island of El Hierro.
